## 2023 Rule Changes

- The League shall consist of the Red and Blue Divisions for 2023.
- Chief Judge - this is an optional position at the discretion of the Referee. The Chief Judge acts as an assistant to the Referee to perform such functions as collecting DQ slips from S\&T officials, communicating the information about the potential DQ to the Referee, and informing coaches of DQs. For this function, the Chief Judge will ask the three questions and communicate this to the Referee who makes the final decision on disqualification. To function as a Chief Judge, the official must attend a Referee/Starter Clinic (5.b.i) or an Experienced S\&T Clinic (5.b.ii) during the current season. The Chief Judge can not make any potential DQ calls, but may help educate newer officials who have questions about rules.
- b. All disqualifications will be reported to and approved by the Referee, after which the Referee or the Chief Judge shall try to notify the coach or the swimmer of the disqualification and the reason for the disqualification. Failure to notify the Coach and/or the Swimmer shall not nullify any disqualification that was properly signaled and recorded.
- It shall be the responsibility of the Home team to have a current copy of the Suburban Swim League Rules and the USA-S rules available during a meet. An electronic version of the USA-S rules is acceptable
- For the 2023 season, swimmers on Red and Blue Division teams may enter and swim in any combination of three (3) events, or may enter and swim in four (4) events providing two (2) of the four events are relays.

Not a change, introduced last year and will continue:

- Swimmers who swim in a lane different than the lane designated on the Roster shall NOT be disqualified for swimming in the wrong lane. The Roster will be adjusted to show the lane the swimmer(s) actually swam in.
- The visiting team shall have the choice of alternate odd- or even-numbered lanes. Lane assignments must be included in the Rosters when submitted to the scoring table (see Section 7(d).
- Lanes will be assigned by the Coach on the Roster submitted to the Scoring Table. Note: No penalty if the swimmer swims in the wrong lane. Rule 7.d, 8.k, 11.f
- There will be one Ready Bench but BOTH teams must supply an assistant coach or adult to function as the Clerk of Course to run the ready bench. Rule 6.a.4, 10.d


## Scoring Practices

$>$ Scorers from the 2 teams each score the meet independently of the other team's scorers.
$>$ No one may linger at the Scorers Table. Scorers may NOT inform Coaches or any other Team personnel as to the other Team's roster or roster changes. All Scorers should be familiar with the League Rules regarding scoring, especially those pertaining to Roster Changes, eligibility to swim events, and points awarded.
$>$ Any discrepancies or errors with the Meet Rosters, any questions or disputes on scoring, or any other issues should be reported to the Meet Referee for resolution.
$>$ Each Scorer should enter the final results of each event on their copy of the Meet Roster, assign points for the first 3 places, and keep a running total of the score. Scorers from opposing teams should compare scores regularly throughout the meet.

## Rosters and Entries

- Two complete meet rosters must be submitted to the Scorers fifteen (15) minutes before the start of the Meet.
- The rosters must include the first and last name of each swimmer; if two swimmers have the same first and last name, then a differentiation must be made. Note: 30 minutes is recommended.
- One of these rosters must be declared as the Official Roster and clearly marked.
- Each Team shall give their Official Roster to the scorers of the Opposing Team. At the conclusion of the Meet, each Team shall take and retain the Official Roster of the Opposing Team.
- A submitted roster may not list more Official swimmers than the Team is entitled to based on the number of official lanes to be swum. Additional swimmers may be listed, but MUST be designated as Unofficial or Exhibition. If no swimmers are listed as Unofficial or Exhibition, the first 2 (or 3) swimmers listed will be treated as official.


## Rosters and Entries

- Scorers transfer the names of the swimmers and lane in each event from the Meet Roster to the Timer Sheets.
- Scorers may NOT assign lanes to the swimmers. Lanes will be assigned by the coaches and included on the roster. Teams are assigned lanes before the meet.
- Scoring shall continue until the completion of the meet. At the completion of the meet, the reported score of the winning team shall be no more than 340 . The score should not be announced until the completion of the meet.

## Scoring

Individual Events:
$1^{\text {st }}$ place, 5 points
$2^{\text {nd }}$ place, 3 points
$3^{\text {rd }}$ place, 1 point

## Relays Events:

$1^{\text {st }}$ place, 7 points
$2^{\text {nd }}$ place, 3 points
$3^{\text {rd }}$ place, 1 point

In case of a tie, the total points for both places will be divided between the swimmers.
One team cannot score all 3 places in any event. If a team places first, second, and third in an event, the other team will receive the 3rd place points; provided that an official swimmer from that team has finished the event legally.

## Completion of the Event

$>$ Head Timer records the times after event is swum.The Referee will report all Disqualifications to the Head Timer.
> The Head Timer will mark "DQ" in the Place column of the Event Card.
$>$ A Disqualification Card must be the SSL provided DQ card or a USA Swimming DQ Slip.The Disqualification Card will be attached to the Event Card at the Scorer's Table.
Place Judges record the order of finish as he/she observed it on Place Judge Form (or similar) and delivered to the Scorers Table with the Event Card.

Place Judges shall NOT consult with each other before recording their order of finish, but may call a TIE if that is what is observed.

## Determining Order of Finish

- If the order of finish reported by both Place Judges is the same, that order of finish is Official (regardless of the times).
- If the order of finish reported by the Place Judges is not the same for all places, use the Modified Ballot System to determine the order of finish for all swimmers in the event.
- The Referee has no authority to judge the order of finish, but should insure that appropriate procedures are followed and is responsible to resolve any difficulties in determining the order of finish.


## Roster Changes

- Roster changes during the meet must be submitted in writing (preferably on $3 \times 5$ cards provided by the League or on similar index cards).
- May only be submitted by the coach or his/her representative to the Scorer's table.
- Must be received at least two events prior to the event being changed. (Example: changes in event \# 49 must be received before the start of event \# 47.) Changes in Events \# 1, 2, or 3 must be submitted before the start of Event \#1.
- Start of event is when the Referee blows the whistle to call the swimmers to the starting line.
- Must be handed to a Scorer; the Scorers shall record the number of the event in progress on the roster change card when it is received. All roster changes must conform to these rules; no exceptions will be permitted.
- In the event that the Scorers fail to record a change that was submitted at a proper time, this shall not be cause for disqualification of any swimmer in that event.

## How to score - Event Card

Step 1 - Make sure you have all the required paperwork
Event Card
2 Place judge sheets
DQ Slips (if there are any)
Step 2 - Do the place judges agree on order of finish?
If they agree, populate the place next to each lane on the event card
If they do not agree, complete a ballot (we will cover that in the next example)

Step 3 - Disqualification cards received:
Write 'DQ' on the event card in the 'PLACE' column
Write the reason in the 'DQ' column
Step 4 Exhibition
Write 'EX on the event card in the 'PLACE' column
Step 5 - Record the order of finish for each lane in the 'PLACE' column
If lanes finishing faster disqualified or were exhibition, slower lanes receive the better place
Step 6 - Write the total points for that event and the running score for each team on the event card at the bottom of the 'PLACE' column

## How to score - Roster

1. Transfer the place and times to the Roster (If the swimmer was disqualified, write DQ in the place box. If the swimmer was exhibition, write EX in the place box)
2. Add total points for the event and place in the larger 'Scr' box
3. Total the score from the previous event + the new earned points and populate in the smaller 'Scr' box
4. Write the total for the page at the bottom, and carry it to the top of the next page

## Ballot Steps:

1. Ballot in center area of the event card
2. Use ALL swimmers times, regardless of exhibition or DQ
3. Enter order of finish: (T) time, $1^{\text {st }}$ Place Judge, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Place Judge
4. Total all 3
5. Place by points
6. Cross out any DQs or Exhibition/Unofficial, then reorder

## Scorer Summary

1) Arrive 30-40 minutes before the meet; at home meets be sure there are a Rule Book and League Rules visible on the table.
2) Two complete meet rosters must be submitted to the clerks 15 minutes before the start of the meet. One of these rosters must be declared as the Official roster and be so marked. The Official Roster is to be given to the opposing Team's scorer.
3) Transfer names from Meet Roster to Event Cards.
4) Event Card is to be handed to the Head Timer. After event is completed, the card is returned to the home team scorer with times and disqualifications.
5) Enter results of events onto Meet Roster. Assign points. In case of a tie, the total points for both places will be divided between the swimmers. One team cannot score all 3 places in any event.
6) Roster changes must be handed to the scorers table at least two events prior to the event being changed. Changes in Events \#1, 2, or 3 must be submitted before the start of Event \#1. An event shall begin when the Referee blows his whistle to call the swimmers to the starting line. Record change on Rosters and Event Cards. Record the event number in progress on Change Cards when submitted.
7) No one may linger at Scorers' Table except Officials. Coaches may request score.
8) At Division Meets, Age Group Tally Sheets must be completed by the home team. Also, keep a record of double and triple winners and check team record (use yards column at yards pools). The home team is responsible for reporting meet and age group results to the league, and submitting information to the media.
9) At the end of each page, check running score with the home team scorers.
10) Swimmers not listed on official roster but who competes in an event shall be viewed as an exhibition swimmer and shall suffer no penalty. A swimmer who is listed on the roster but does NOT compete has that event count as one of his/her official swims.
11) Results of each event are only official when they have been recorded by scorers of both teams; only then may it be announced. Cumulative score is generally announced and/or posted at the end of each stroke, only after all scorers results agree. Teams retain the rosters they scored.
