Sportsmanship & League Philosophy (See SSL Rules page 1)

The Rules of the SSL are based upon the following principles:

- 1) The SSL encourages individuals to participate in competitive swimming as a *member of one of the teams* in the SSL.
- 2) The SSL wants participation by all swim team members to be a *fun and rewarding* experience, conducted in a safe and healthy atmosphere.
- 3) The competitive environment in the SSL is based on *good sportsmanship, fair play, team spirit*, and participation by all swimmers in all meets, both Dual Meets and SSL Championships.
- 4) The SSL encourages the *development and improvement* of a swimmer's competitive swimming skills.
- 5) The competitive environment is not intended to be only at a high level of swimming competition. The SSL encourages *participation* by swimmers of all abilities, from the novice swimmer to the elite level swimmer.
- 6) The SSL believes that *safety* of swimmers, coaches, officials and spectators is of primary importance.
- 7) The SSL believes that all swimmers, coaches, representatives and parents should conduct themselves with *integrity, honesty and fairness*

Transgender Swimmers

- SSL allows members of SSL teams to participate in accordance with his/her/their gender identity
- Swimmer must swim in the girl's or boy's events of the gender they identify with for the entire SSL season
 - The gender they identify with at the first dual meet that they participate in is the gender they must compete in for the entire season
- All pools should be prepared for transgender swimmers and know how they will handle use of changing facilities and bathrooms.
- The recommendation is that all the pools should do this in case they have any transgender people at their pool, not just for SSL swim meets.
- The team with a transgender swimmer should communicate that to their opponent between the Reps without disclosing the identity of the transgender swimmer

SSL Code of Conduct

Pertains to ALL team members, coaches, officials, parents and spectators

Un-sporting behavior includes (but not limited to):

- Insulting or derogatory remarks, gestures or acts including taunting
- Trying to influence or showing disgust with the decision of an official
- Use of Obscene language
- Physical abuse or threats
- Any act of vandalism.

Any potential Code violations to be brought to attention of Meet Referee by the Head Coach, the Team Rep or a designee

For TT & Champs, bring to Champ Chair (Kent)

SSL Code of Conduct (cont'd)

Repeated violators will be asked to leave the pool property

When appropriate, a 'CofC Resolution form' should be completed and submitted to the League for possible review by the SSL Protest Committee

Dual Meets 2024

- Normal dual meets
- Rule Changes are retained
 - Rosters must include lane assignments
 - Changes to lane assignments with Change Cards
 - Both teams provide a Clerk of Course at the Ready Bench an adult of assistant coach who knows the swimmers
- SSL Rules are on the website. Please review to refresh your memory and see administrative changes

Dual Meet Entries

• Rule 8.b - Swimmers in both the Red and the Blue Divisions may enter swim in any combination of three (3) events, or may enter and swim in four (4) events providing two (2) of the four events are relays.

This previously applied to the White and Blue divisions. This change allows the larger teams to have 2 or 3 entries in relay events.

SSL Stroke & Turn Rule Interpretations

- See SSL guideline Stroke & Turn Interpretations 2023 no changes from 2022
- 6 & Under and 8 & Under Swimmers
 - Applies to dual meets only, not Time Trials and Championships
 - Applies to all dual meets the entire season

Exhibition Swimmers and Exhibition/Unofficial Heats at SSL Dual Meets

- Each team is allowed 6 exhibition heats during a meet
 - Exhibition races should be run after the official event
 - A team may not use Exhibition Heats that the opposing team does not use

Exhibition heat options

- o A team may combine together swimmers of different ages and different genders during an exhibition event
- A team may not combine together different strokes or distances during an individual event (see exception for freestyle relays)
- Empty lanes in an exhibition heat may be filled by swimmers from the opposing team

Relay Exhibitions

- Exhibition Heats of 100 y/m relays may be swum after the last 100 y/m relay. These relays may combine age groups and genders (boys and girls can swim on the same relay team) and may be swum as Freestyle Relays during the Medley Relays. The same applies for 200 y/m relays.
- Exhibition Relays result in 4 times as many splashes as exhibition individual events.
- Exhibition Freestyle Relays for younger swimmers swum with the Medley Relays allow the younger swimmers on Wednesday night meets to get home at a reasonable time, rather than after 9:00 PM

Exhibitions (cont'd)

• 5 lane pools

- Exhibition lane should be shared between the 2 teams
- If the visiting team has a 6 lane pool, the host team should have priority using the exhibition lane because the visiting team has use of 3 lanes in their home meets
- o Coaches and Team Reps should agree on the use of the exhibition lane before the meet

Swimmer participation

- Swimmers may swim in an unlimited number of exhibition races, HOWEVER, Exhibition heats are intended for swimmers that are not participating in official events
- Exhibition swims do NOT count toward the official entry limits per swimmer

Scoring

- Exhibition swims do NOT earn points for the overall meet scoring nor for the age group scoring
- Do NOT make swimmers exhibition to avoid running up the team score as that will influence an age group score. The maximum team score that is reported or published is 340

Weather related meet postponements or Cancellations

- It is intended that all weather-related meet postponements are competed on an alternate date
- A Cancellation is NOT a forfeiture
 - Team W-L and age-group are NOT recorded
- Postponing due to Rain
 - Should only be done if rain is so heavy that the bottom of the pool cannot be seen (safety issue)

Concussion Protocol

- Information on Concussions is on the SSL Reps Page "Concussion Training"
- Concussions can occur in swim meets and practices
 - Circle swims that overlap
 - Backstroke and butterfly finishes
 - Backstrokers swim into the corner of L shaped pools
- Concussions may not manifest symptoms for several days
- Notify parents
- If symptoms occur, clearance by a qualified medical professional is needed
- If in doubt, sit them out

Time Trials & Championships – Renewed Approach

- TT entry counts continue on a downward trend
- Combining 9-10 & 11-12 TTs this year
- Philosophy regarding TTs

Time Trials (TT) - Eligibility

- Must have competed in at least four dual meets during the <u>current</u> season
- Can use a team specific time trial to get a time
 Include a timer and an official to observe the swim(s)
- Impact of a meet cancellation

Swimmers must still have competed in four dual meets during the current season A cancellation simply eliminates an opportunity for a dual meet competition If a team as an official Bye (on the SSL schedule), the Bye can count as one of the four meets

Time Trials (TT)

Entries

- Swimmer: 3 maximum events; swim in own age group
- o Team: 6 maximum individual entries per event for 6&U, 8&U, 9-10, and 11-12; unlimited for 13 & above
- Relays: Now unlimited (was: 2 maximum per event per team); must designate the swimmer names in your entries


Swim Attire

- No caps or suits of year-round clubs or HS teams → summer clubs or plain
- Must comply with USA Swim suit requirements

Volunteers

- o Sign-ups are online; do NOT send in with entries!
- o Two volunteers per TT; officials do not count
